NFRBMEA Executive Summary

Wayne Pike, NFRBMEA President

The past year was busy and productive for the NFRBMEA. We had the home farm to plow plus some new land to break. The good work of a dedicated Board and engaged members made it possible to further our mission to promote and support farm and ranch business management education. Here are some of the highlights of our efforts.

- We continued to support and guide the Institute for Ag Business Management Education (IABME). IABME was created through a grant initiated by the NFRBMEA and has become one of our major efforts to encourage, support and educate our early service members. IABME is clearly a success. The challenge is to continue its funding when the original grant is used up.
- We increased our support to the National Council for Agricultural Education. Our membership on this Council is the only voice of agricultural education for established producers in the nation. Our Board has approved the appointment of our representative to the Council as a full-fledged NFRBMEA Board of Directors' member to give added emphasis to the importance placed on this position. This Board action is pending member approval at our 2010 conference.
- Our annual conference continues to be the major effort in fulfilling our mission. The 2010 conference (NFRBMEA's 38th) marks the fifth conference in cooperation with our NAFBAS partners and the second cooperating with the North Central Extension Economists. We look forward to renewing our agreement to continue these joint operations in the future.
- The Nuts and Bolts Real-Time Update is developing as a recognizable and useful communications tool for our members and friends.
- Our website, www.nfrbmea.org, continues to grow in usefulness as the collective organizational memory and our active day-to-day access to NFRBMEA's activities.

Some of our activities have been more administrative in nature, but are necessary as we realize changes need to be made in structure and operations.

- Our past-presidents recommended that changes be made to our Board of Directors to more
 accurately reflect actual Board responsibilities. The Board of Directors has approved changes to
 our by-laws that will go before the membership at the 2010 conference for approval.
- The proposed by-law changes, if approved, required that new job descriptions be created. The Board accomplished this and the new job descriptions will go into effect if and when the by-law changes are approved.
- The Board adopted a reimbursement and travel expense policy. There had been no written policy prior to this. The Board thought it was due diligence to have one.
- The use of Webinars has improved communication and cut Board meeting expense. Since July 2009, we used Webinars for at least five Board of Director meetings and seven 2010 conference planning meetings. This represents at least 18 hours of discussions and planning that may not have happened as effectively otherwise.

- An opportunity that we have not yet explored in depth is the use of social networking to further our mission. This is a major factor for many forward-thinking businesses that might work for NFRBMEA.
- We continue to develop our connections with industry friends who find value in and share our belief in our mission.

Our challenge is to continue our mission in the face of budget realities. Our opportunities lie with the many dedicated professionals in our ranks who see beyond budget cuts to a brighter future.

It has been a good year for the NFRBMEA and 2010-2011 will be even better.

In 1973, instructors using the farm/ranch analysis developed in Minnesota, were invited to Faribault, Minnesota, for three days to participate in an exchange of ideas and to make improvements to that analysis. National Council for Agricultural Education Update

It has been a pleasure and privilege for me to serve this past year as the Adult Level Instructor representative on the National Council for Agricultural Education, NCAE. This 3-year term position on the 19 person board is appointed by the NFRBMEA. My term will expire December 31, 2010. Therefore, NFRBMEA is in the process of seeking applications for this position to begin January 1, 2011. Applications are available upon request from me or the NFRBMEA President and are to be completed and returned to the board by September 1 to be reviewed at the fall Board Meeting.

The NCAE typically meets twice per year at varied locations around the U.S. with frequent communication throughout the year to resolve areas of need. This past year meetings were held in Morristown, New Jersey and Washington D.C. I now serve on the executive committee and act as chairperson of several committees.

The NCAE represents and provides advocacy for stake holders from all areas of agricultural education in the United States and 3 U.S. territories. The NCAE strives to identify current and emerging issues of national concern and attempts to provide innovative solutions to these issues thereby strengthening programs and promoting success for students and instructors of agricultural education.



Many of the activities of The Council are directed toward secondary Ag Ed and the FFA, however a number of NCAE projects have major impact on Farm Management Education.

The NCAE commissioned AgrowKnowledge (www.agrowknow.org/) to establish a national Post Secondary and Adult database of institutions and instructors to better access and coordinate these entities. This data base should be a major benefit to NFRBMEA to be able to provide an exchange of Farm Management information and expertise to a greater number of states and institutions. This effort helps to support the NCAE goal of expanding the scope of quality Ag Ed programs.

The NCAE has provided NFRBMEA with a two way path of information and awareness of mission and relevance. As an example, the NFRBMEA has been the benefactor of the insight and guidance to have an opportunity to apply for grants that could serve to secure the future funding and development of many of its functions and activities.

As a member of the NCAE, the NFRBMEA has been able to maintain a national presence within the Ag Ed community. This position has been able to better inform other members of Team Ag Ed (http://teamaged.org/) of the activities of NFRBMEA.

Minutes of the NFRBMEA 24th Annual Business Meeting

June 16 & 18, 2009 * St. Louis, Missouri

The meeting was called to order by President Paul Gorman at 3:45 PM. A motion to adopt the revised agenda was made and seconded. Motion passed. Paul invited Jay Jackman from the National Association of Agricultural Education (NAAE) to make a short presentation. Jay thanked all FBM instructors for what they do toward furthering agricultural education. Jay encouraged us to visit the NAAE "Communities of Practice" website and go to its AgEd Learning Center link for lesson planning and other instructional material. He invited all FBM instructors to submit educational resources to the database.

Paul Gorman indicated that there is a committee of two NAFBAS members and two NFRBMEA members appointed to explore possible 2012 conference locations and invited members to share suggestions for 2012 conference locations.

Secretary Jay D. Olsen conducted the Roll Call of States. Members from Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, Missouri, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Utah, and Wisconsin presented reports. The conference notebook contains written reports for all these states with the exception of Colorado and Wisconsin. Oregon, Oklahoma, and Pennsylvania sent written reports that are in the conference notebook, but did not have a member at the business meeting. States with FBM programs that did not submit a report and were not present at the business meeting were Iowa, Nebraska, Illinois and Kentucky. Jay D. Olsen also reported that Washington will be losing their last instructor at the end of June, Idaho has a FBM program at Boise State with an outreach instructor in the Lewiston area, and there is still a functioning program in Montana.

Wayne Pike introduced the Exchange of Ideas and invited Ira Beckman (MN) to show the spreadsheet he uses to determine the cash required per unit for a specific enterprise. Jennifer Smith (MN) presented her idea of preparing "Harvest Bags" which are delivered to farmers in the fields during harvest season. The "harvest bags" are used as a recruitment tool and filled with donated items such as snacks, a notepad, and a pen from ag businesses and banks, along with FBM instructor contact information. Paul Gorman (MN) shared his Management Checklist for preparing farmers/students for future instructional visits and as a review/check list to account for what was done. Jay Stretcher (CO) illustrated how a loan is not an expense using a one-dollar bill based to another person with the intent to pass it back. Jay D. Olsen (UT) presented a spreadsheet for calculating average head per year in a feedlot/back-grounding enterprise. \$100 checks were awarded to Jay D. Olsen and Jay Stretcher; IOUs were awarded to Ira, Jennifer, and Paul as Doug was rationing checks from the checkbook. Doug will get checks for the IOUs when new checks are received.

Officer nominations for 2009-2010 were presented by Past President John Hobert. John indicated that Al Graner accepted to run for President Elect. John also talked to each current officer who agreed to nomination for a second term. They are: Jay D. Olsen, Secretary; Doug Wertish, Treasurer; Virgil Dagman, Membership Secretary; and Dan Hoffman, Historian.

A proposal from the Past President's meeting on Board Reorganization was distributed (see attached document "Past President's Board Restructure Proposal"). Pat and Ira explained that the restructuring proposal requires a change in the by-laws. The NFRBMEA by-laws state that all by-law changes need to be presented to the membership 90 days prior to a vote in a business meeting. The membership will address this proposal at next year's business meeting. Pat and Ira explained the restructuring which consists of an Executive Board made of seven members including President, President Elect, Past President, Secretary, Treasurer, National Council Representative, and Current Conference Chair. Committee Chair positions include, but are not limited to the future Conference Chair, Fundraising/ Industry Relations, Teaching Resources and IABME Chair. Other chairs for committees, such as Membership & Recruitment, could be added as needed. The restructuring proposal also specifies that the hired position would have responsibilities as the Communications Director and would be

responsible for historian duties, NUTS & BOLTS publishing, webmaster duties, and membership. Information on the proposed restructuring will appear in NUTS & BOLTS following the fall Board meeting.

The Secretary's report was given by Jay D. Olsen. The report is in the NFRBMEA 2008-2009 Annual Report. The minutes of all meetings, from the 2008 Annual Business Meeting in Fresno to the 2009 Spring Board meeting appear in the Annual Report, as well as on the Web. Motion to accept the Secretary's Report made by Ira Beckman and seconded by Jay M. Olson to approve. Motion passed.

Doug Wertish gave the Treasurer's report. The balance sheet and the income statement were reviewed and Doug answered a few questions that were asked. Pat Harrington moved to accept the Treasurer's Report; second by John Woodford. Motion passed.

Meeting adjourned at 5:30 to reconvene on Thursday morning following the General Session.

Thursday, June 18, 2009

Paul Gorman called the meeting to order at 9:55 AM. Virgil Dagman gave the Membership Secretary's Report, which also appears in the 2008-09 Annual Report on page 5. Tom Ackerman moved to accept the report and Gary Thome seconded. Motion passed.

Deb Pike presented the NUTS & BOLTS Co-editors' Report, which appears on page 95 of the Annual Report. Deb reported that four issues of NUTS & BOLTS went out and very few were returned as undeliverable, indicating that email addresses for the most part are active. Deb indicated that they are always looking for NUTS & BOLTS articles. She also thanked advertisers by name for their support through advertising in the NUTS & BOLTS.

In the Historian's Report, Dan Hoffman indicated that Laurie Morgan had sent a nice box of historical information to Dan. Dan invited anyone that has pictures of the 2010 conference to send them to him. Deb Pike presented the Webmaster's Report. The NFRBMEA website has been maintained and contains a current list of members and all past business and board meeting minutes. Deb has kept the Yahoo mailing groups current, set up a Ride & Room Share group for the conference, developed the 2009 Conference and IABME web sites.

John Hobert reported that 100 copies of the NFRBMEA Annual Report had been printed by Riverland Community College. Deb has the templates to add committee reports for developing the Annual Report which makes it very easy to put each year's Annual Report together.

Wayne Pike gave a report of First-Timers. The First-Timers money of \$500 went to John Morgan from MO. At last fall's NFRBMEA Board Meeting, the board elected to split the First-Timers money among First-Timers from FBM areas outside of the Bremer Foundation area – instructors from ND, MN, and WI are in the Bremer Foundation area and will be in the IABME workshop with Bremer Grant funds paying for their costs - and since John was the only First Timer outside ND, MN or WI he received the \$500.

Standing and Special Committee Reports

• The Resource Committee report was given by Deb Pike. Quiet year; the only postings were from last year's "Exchange of Ideas". In the past month, a counter has been added to each Resource Library page and shows a number of visitors to the various pages since then. The Links page has had visitors but that page has no content yet. She invited anyone with useful links to submit them to the Resource Library. The NAAE Communities of Practice site has a link to our Resource Library. Deb and Wayne passed out a five- question survey and asked everyone to respond and get them back to her.

Minutes of the NFRBMEA 24th Annual Business Meeting (cont'd)

- The IABME Committee Report was given by Jim Kelm and Tom Weygandt, and appears on page 8 of the Annual Report. Jim reviewed the beginnings of the Institute and receiving the Bremer Grant; he thanked those that worked to get the grant. The committee met in St Cloud, organized the Job Description for the Program Director, conducted interviews in the following weeks and hired Tom Weygandt in October of 2008. Jim introduced Tom and invited him to report. The Institute's objectives this past year were to work with early-career FBM instructors, teaching technical information through webinars, encouraging them to attend the NFRBMEA conference and a workshop which immediately followed the conference. Nine people signed up for the webinar, and six of those are at the conference. The current thinking for the coming year is to start with regional meetings this fall, conduct a series of webinars throughout the year, and sponsor a speaker at next year's conference. Tom reported that 304 farms and 570 individuals have been affected by the nine people participating in the Institute this year. Tom distributed a report showing where the money has gone to run the Institute. Tom indicated that there is about \$1,200 available for conducting the mentoring program beginning this summer and fall. Jim reminded us that IABME is a design-build program, and will continue to evolve as needed.
- In his **Industry Relations Report**, John Hobert indicated that a list of donors appears on page 29 of the Annual Report. Committee members for this year are: Lyle Stewart, Bryan Manny, Michael Clark, Jim McCabe, John Hobert, Gary Thome, and Al Graner. John reviewed the past year's donations-- \$13,200 cash, and in-kind amounting to \$7,300-- for a total conference contribution of \$19,500. A Pfizer representative sat in on the conference meetings yesterday and indicated they would be a Gold sponsor for next year. John hopes that CNH will be a back as a sponsor next year, and indicated that Agco has expressed some interest in donating next year. Vendors paid \$400 for a vendor spots. John reviewed the sponsor levels and the benefits sponsors receive of vendor and conference registration waivers, speaker time (10 min.), and presence on NFRBMEA's webpage. John reminded us to write a letter to the sponsors and thank them for their sponsorship. He invited those who have possible sponsorship contacts to visit with any committee member and pass along the contact information.
- The National Council Report was given by Jay M. Olson, and it appears on Page 7 of the Annual Report. Jay reviewed why NFRBMEA has presence on the Council and the other groups that are represented on The Council. Jay indicated that we are fortunate to have a voice on the Council for Adult FBM Education. The Council is working to produce a directory of adult education programs in the U.S. with a \$15,000 contribution from AgroKnowledge.
- Jesse Schwanke and John Sponaugle gave the 2009 St. Louis Conference update. There were 139 registrations, 70 spouse registrations, and 60 plus kids.
- In the **2010 Fargo-Moorhead Conference Committee Report**, Rick Morgan reminded us that it's a cooperative effort between ND and MN and will also involve the North Central Farm Business Management Extension. With the combined sponsorship and the resources of North Dakota State University, they are anticipating an exceptional conference.

Future Conferences:

- The 2011 Conference to be hosted by NAFBAS, and the probable location is Memphis, TN.
- 2012 Conference location possibilities: Alabama or New York state, although nothing is firm. Sponsorships from the usual sponsors might be a concern if the conference is out of the Midwest area two years in a row.

The Board election was held. John Hobert asked for further nominations for President Elect. Seeing none, John Sponaugle moved to cease nominations; the motion was seconded by Pat Harrington. Motion passed. John reviewed the candidate list: Secretary- Jay D. Olsen, Treasurer- Doug Wertish, Membership Secretary- Virgil

Dagman, and Historian- Dan Hoffman. No further nominations were made, Jay M. Olson moved to close nominations; motion seconded by John Woodford. Motion passed.

Attending: President Wayne Pike, Deb Pike, Rick Morgan, Jay M. Olson, Virgil Dagman, Dan Hoffman, Jay D. Olsen, Doug Wertish, and Paul Gorman. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 AM.

Jay M. Olson, moved to extend the First Timer's meeting to include all first time attendees from NFRBMEA and NAFBAS, and any first-time conference attendees from the Northwest Extension group for the 2010 Conference in Fargo. Seconded by Virgil Dagman; motion passed.

The NFRBMEA board approved a recommendation on a conference level to include NAFBAS in the Exchange of Ideas activity. Dan Hoffman moved, second by Jay M. Olson; motion passed.

Rick reviewed possible options for Monday and Tuesday evening activities. IABME offered to be a conference sponsor with a speaker or a meal and break. They would like to integrate more IABME activities with conference activities that meet their needs. The Board meeting adjourned at 10:40 AM and moved to Room 119 for the Joint NFRBMEA-NAFBAS Board meeting.

The Board meeting reconvened September 29, 2009 at 10:20 AM. Wayne asked President Elect Al Graner and Past President Paul Gorman to serve on a combined committee to work with NAFBAS on combining NFRBMEA's Exchange of Ideas with NAFBAS's Professional Papers.

Wayne called the meeting to order at 8:06 AM CDT. He asked for any additional agenda items; no additional items were added.

Jay D. Olsen gave the Secretary's Report and referred to minutes of the past webinar which are on the website.

Doug gave the Treasurer's report. Doug sent the financial reports to everyone last week. The 2011 Nashville Conference's projected revenue is \$7000, which may be optimistic because it is "out of state". The 2010 Fargo Conference revenue will be split between NFRBMEA and NAFBAS; the North Central extension group will not participate in conference revenues.

Deb Pike presented the Web Manager's report and NUTS & BOLTS Co-Editor's report emailed to everyone for review. The conference website and agenda are being updated as needed. A registration gateway page has been added to the conference site which links to the conference registration website. The gateway page also contains reference links to the tour and family program descriptions, as well as the membership form for those who are not able to attend the conference this year. A Ride/Room Share Yahoogroup has been set up to coordinate ride and room sharing for the conference. Additionally, two RTUs have been sent out since January, to both members and non- members. Deb is also looking into creating a Facebook presence for NFRBMEA. Dan indicated that Deb has done the lion's share of the NUTS & BOLTS Editor work and that her report covered everything.

Deb reported that the Resource Library has had no new postings. Dan indicated that one instructor tried to make a posting but got discouraged when filling out the application and giving permission for his project to be available for others to use. Wayne indicated that the Resource Library does not take a lot of time to maintain and could effectively be maintained without a lot of effort.

Tom Weygandt did not attend the webinar and Wayne indicated that there were no issues relating to IABME to report.

Jay M. Olson gave the National Council Report. The Council met in Washington for the spring meeting and there were no FBM actions or concerns to report. The national directory is still in the works and is nearing completion. Jay added that we need applications for a new representative, as his term ends January 2011. He also said that a grant for CFFM Benchmarking is approved but the RFA has not been announced yet; hopefully this summer at the conference Kevin Klair can give us an update.

Doug will not run again as Treasurer, saying four years is long enough for one person to be responsible for an organization's money. Jay D. Olsen is willing to serve another year as Secretary; Virgil Dagman is also willing to serve another term as Membership Secretary.

Paul will try to find potential candidates from different states, especially outside of MN as possible, when compiling a slate of new officers. He also addressed the Annual Report, saying that he and Deb will work together to gather the information for the conference Annual Report. Paul will also contact those who contribute to the report and give them a deadline for submitting their reports.

Wayne asked if there were any additional Distinguished Service Award nominees. At the last board meeting, 3 recipients were named, no additional names were suggested.

Al has not received any submissions for the Experience Exchange. Wayne suggested that ideally one person for NFRBMEA and one from NAFBAS would be selected to make presentations. It may be a little early to expect any submissions because the general membership first heard about the request in the April RTU. Another email invitation will be sent requesting presentation ideas in the next few days.

Al asked about the specific purpose of the First-Timers Meeting. Wayne indicated that its purpose is to introduce NFRBMEA to NAFBAS and NAFBAS to NFRBMEA, and first time conference attendees, to give them background information on organizations and the conference, and to make them feel welcome.

Wayne reviewed the proposed 2010 Annual Business Meeting agenda. The proposed by-law changes will be addressed in the first business meeting session because it will affect the slate of new officers.

Rick gave the Conference Planners Report.
