Mid-September Harvest Note from Randy DeBoer in Nebraska

This update is

In the southern panhandle wheat yielded from 40-80 bushels per acres on dryland. Between Scoular Grain Company and Crossroads Co-op there were 3 million bushels piled on the ground. We also loaded two 110 ten car trains as well as filling all the elevators. Wheat is over \$7/bu. right now. The Proso millet is doing well also. Harvest is just getting started on this crop.

Wayne reports as of October 2 - Here in southern Minnesota we are trying to wrap up soybean harvest. Yields are generally good with many farms reporting 50 to 60 bushels per acre. Some corn is harvested with yields from 170-220 being common. Lots of wet weather is slowing us down. Almost twenty inches of rain has fallen in August and September with every cloud bringing a half inch now.

The 2009 NFRBMEA Conference Planning Committee consists of John Sponaugle (Co-Chair), Missouri; Jesse Schwanke (Co-Chair), Missouri; Paul Gorman, Minnesota; Dr. Norman Rohrbach, Missouri and me. NAFBAS Planning Committee members include Bob Rhea, Illinois; Michael Schmitz, Illinois; Kent Ruppert, Iowa; Rob Holcomb, Minnesota; and Jody Welsch, Kentucky. This committee is scheduled to head to St. Louis this week for a site visit during the dates of September 25th - 27th. We should have an excellent report from this committee at our Fall Joint NFRBMEA/NAFBAS Board Meeting. University of Missouri-Columbia Presentation: This past week, I had the opportunity to present a Web-cam presentation on 'Marketing Your Adult Program' to our counterparts in Missouri at their Conference for Agricultural Instructors of Adults. The Conference was held September 20th - 21st at the Missouri Pork Association in Columbia, Missouri. Aside from a few small technical problems, the presentation from my home office went very well. I continue to encourage you to become more active through our standing committees or volunteering in some manner.
